1636. He bought land and moved to York, Maine in 1642 after marrying  
Judith. Abraham was councillor in 1645; Co Treasurer in 1654; associate  
Judge 1662.  
The following record, written in long hand, was found among  
Billings-Pebble papers, in Weston, Ireland. Abraham Pebble of Saco abt 1652  
died in 1639, took Bath of Fidelity. Recd. to me (York) bought land fr.  
John Hoole 19/July/1645. Took O. of A. to Mass. Govt 22 Nov/1652. Ap.  
Comm to hold court at York. He married at Saco Judith daug.  
of Elder Nathaniel Pidder, a son Nathl Pebble bap. at 2<sup>nd</sup> church  
of Saco Mar. 9. 1648 (Baxter Recds Vol 1) See wills of Pebbles of

He volunteered as a cook during the war, developed malaria in the South, and was never well afterward. He moved to Lynn where he worked in a shoe shop.

Ebenezer, Mary and their son, William, were killed by the Indians, probably at Great Woolwich or Bucksport. The other children were captured, carried to Canada and sold. Mabitable was carried to France and all trace of her lost.

Ebenezer Jr. was taken captive by the Indians with his brother, sister and hired girl (Sarah Flieg) on the day his parents were killed, June 9, 1758, and carried to Canada where he was sold to a French family. He remained there until after the capture of Quebec by the English in 1759 when he was redeemed with the other children by his grandfather Capt. Samuel Hardee. Ebenezer may have served in the Revolution as a private from York.
